(Repeat) MDI Parent Survey - The Middle-Year's Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report survey for children in grades 4 to 8. The MDI was developed through the collaboration of children, community members, scientific experts & teachers. The MDI aims to measure 5 main areas linked to well-being, health and academic achievement, especially: physical health & well-being; connectedness; school experiences; use of after-school time; social & emotional development. The Middle Years Committee is now asking for **your** feedback on our experiences, and the experiences of our children, right here in Chilliwack, as a follow-up to the MDI data collection that took place over the last 2 years. Of specific interest is the impact of COVID 19 and resource availability. Please take 5 minutes and complete this anonymous survey – your feedback is incredibly valued and will help direct our ability to support you, and our children here in Chilliwack.

(Repeat) Province Seeks Input from Indigenous Peoples to Shape Reconciliation - The provincial government is asking Indigenous peoples for additional feedback on the draft action plan required under the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act.
