<u>(REPEAT) Student School Supplies</u> – This school year we are working with several vendors to purchase supplies for students that are unique to each classroom and learning situation. The cost will be \$45.00 for students in grades 1 - 5 (including planners) and \$40.00 for children in Kindergarten. Classroom teachers will be in touch shortly to arrange for collecting funds from students. Payments can be made with cash or a cheque made out to "Evans Elementary School".

(REPEAT) Bell Schedule - Our school has some changes in the bell schedule to accommodate a 2 week spring break this year for families and students. This fall we have a single Bell Schedule as there are no learning cohorts. Our bell schedule this year is as follows:

(REPEAT) Calendar & Upcoming Events – The Google calendar on our website is a "live" calendar meaning it is updated in real time as soon as we add or change an event. Keeping checking our calendar for updates to information and events. Important dates and information will also be included in the Week at a Glance and any newsletters. Currently there are a number of events on the calendar listed as TENTATIVE as we will need to see if these events can go forward (in their current form) based on the current situation with COVID -19 and the protocols that are in place at the time. We thank you for your understanding around this.

(REPEAT) School PBS Matrix & Code of Conduct – Our school has two approached to helping students understand behavioral expectations. Our School Matrix (attached) are the positive behaviors we teach to students on a daily basis and are part of our "gotcha being good" draws. *We focus on all students being Kind, Respectful and Responsible !!* The Code of Conduct is a requirement of the BC Ministry of Education and sets out expectations for items such as conduct, dress, etc. while students are at school. (REPEAT) Website – As much as possible we will try and keep the website up-to-date once the school year has begun. Important information from the school district & school will be posted on the front page of the school website. Please keep checking this for the latest information. (Other pages on the website are currently being revised and should be updated shortly with information from the current school year).

(REPEAT) After School Care – Wind and Tide runs a before and after-school child care program at Evans Elementary School. Should you be interested in having your child in childcare please contact them directly at (604)847-3254.

(REPEAT) Volunteers – Our plan is to have parent volunteer opportunities at the school this year following COVID-19 protocols. As this will require planning and training of all volunteers (and in smaller numbers), we are in the process of putting this together. Once we have developed a volunteer protocol with the school district and staff, we will share a process for parents who wish to volunteer. All volunteers must have completed a Criminal Records Check. The forms can be obtained from our office.

(REPEAT) Drop off & Pick-Up Of Children

Morning Drop Off

In the morning when students are arriving at school we ask that they not arrive before 7:50am when supervision is available. For parents who walk their child to school (or are here with their child) we ask that you remain behind the fenced area at the front or on the "track area" if you walk your child to the side of the school. For parents who drive their children we ask that you drop and leave after ensuring your child is safely off the parking lot or driveway areas.

Afternoon Pick-Up

For parents who are who walking their child home (or waiting to pick their child up) from school we ask that you arrange to meet your child behind the fenced area at the front of the school or on the "track area" to the side of the school. For parents who drive their children and have their vehicles in the drop off and pick-up areas, we ask that you remain with your vehicles in the front driveway leaving only briefly to ensuring your child gets safety into the vehicle.

We thank you so much for your help and support with this plan. We are working hard to ensure that all children are as safe as possible at all times during the day including to and from school.

Re: Back to School in the Fraser Health region

Dear School Staff Members and Community,

As we begin the 2021/2022 school year, we would like to express our appreciation for the hard work and dedication teachers, school staff and school administrators have shown over the past 18 months, and continue to show, as you prepare for a safe return to school this fall.

On August 24, 2021, the province announced new <u>K-12 COVID-19 safety guidelines</u> for 2021/22. Below we have highlighted some of the key changes, as well as what we can expect to remain the same from last year.

Vaccination:

- Vaccination is the best way to protect our communities and ourselves. Vaccination protects both those who get vaccinated and those who are not yet eligible for vaccinations, such as youth under 12 years of age. Everyone 12 and older is encouraged to walk in to any of our vaccine clinics for same-day immunization as soon as possible. Clinic locations are available at fraserhealth.ca/vax.
- Health and safety measures such as daily health checks, hand washing and the use of masks are in effect at schools to protect both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals.
- For more information on youth immunization, please review the <u>BCCDC Q&A document</u>, or visit the <u>province of B.C.</u> and <u>BCCDC</u> web resources for more information.

Masks:

- At this time, all K to 12 staff, students in grades 4 to 12, and visitors should wear masks in all indoor areas, including at their desks and on school buses.
- Mask use for students in kindergarten to grade three is encouraged.

Daily health checks:

- Students will continue to be required to complete daily health checks, stay home when feeling sick and practice diligent hand hygiene.
- The <u>K to 12 Health Check website</u> and app can help kids and parents decide if their child should attend school based on their symptoms. Encourage parents to bookmark the <u>health check</u> <u>website</u> or download the apps for <u>iPhone/iPad iOS</u> or <u>Android devices</u>.

In-classroom learning:

• Strict physical distancing and cohorting is no longer required. However, schools can continue to create space between people by spreading people out where possible, managing flow of people in common areas to prevent crowding, taking students outside as much as possible and reminding students and staff about respecting others' physical space.

• Schools should continue to apply effective prevention measures such as cleaning and disinfecting of frequently touched surfaces, ensuring ventilation systems are working properly and providing frequent opportunities for hand hygiene.

COVID-19 exposure at school:

As per provincial direction, public health will notify staff and students who need to take a specific action, such as self-monitoring or self-isolation, as a result of a COVID-19 exposure. The school community will be notified when appropriate, such as in the case of an outbreak, and this will be posted to our website. Public health will continue to provide contact tracing for all positive cases of COVID-19 in schools:

- If a student or staff member is confirmed to have COVID-19, and were potentially infectious while they were at school, public health will investigate to determine if there were any potential close contacts within the school.
- If it is determined that there are close contacts within the school, public health will notify the school administrators and request information to assist with contact tracing and provide guidance on what steps should be taken.
- Public health may then:
 - Recommend 14-day self-isolation if necessary
 - Recommend self-monitoring for symptoms if necessary
 - Provide follow-up recommendations if necessary
- Schools will ensure students who are required to self-isolate are able to continue their educational program. Together, schools and public health officials will determine if any other actions are necessary.
- Parents, caregivers and families will be notified by public health if their child is determined to be a close contact of a COVID-19 positive person.
